Infant has begun feeding	Only for completion of feed then discard	Discard	Discard

Tips:

- Ensure hands are clean and containers are sterile either by boiling, steaming or chemical
- Cool your breastmilk in the fridge before adding to another lot of expressed breast milk (EBM)
- Always add cold milk to cold milk
- Write the date and time on the container
- Use the oldest breastmilk first
- NEVER refreeze breastmilk which has already been defrosted
- The safest way to defrost breastmilk is in the fridge. If in a hurry, breast milk can be defrosted in a jug of warm water. **NEVER HEAT IN BOILING WATER**
